

## Quick overview on doing custom labels for books ...

Thank you for your interest in customizing our "It's A Disaster!" books. On small and rush orders, Fedhealth provides FREE peel & stick laser-printed labels with verbiage you'd like conveyed to recipients. *(We can customize books in print process on 1,000 units & up but may take months to deliver – please call or visit “Free Customization” page.)*

Many agencies, businesses and nonprofits use free stickers on our standard books to include local contact information, logos / seals, emergency phone #s, shelter locations or other special messages to personalize them for their respective area.

We can do 1-2 labels per book -- even a 3rd or 4th sticker if needed - whatever's best for you. As fyi, we ship labels separately so your group gets to decide where best to place them on/in books.

Some sample labels are viewable online on our “Free Customization” page. More samples are available upon request and we can fax or email them, if needed.
